PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION Students must maintain a grade of C or better in professional education courses; GPA of 3.00 ** is required to be admitted into and retained in the Teacher Education Program, to enroll in early field experience, student teach, and graduate. Additionally, all IDSE majors must obtain passing scores on Praxis Core and II and the VCLA. Students are not allowed to take additional courses during the Early Field Exp. and student teaching semesters. Students can have no more than 6 hours of concentration courses to complete after student teaching. All other course work including EDUC 304, EDEF 320, EDRD 314, and EDUC 310 must be completed prior to entering the early field experience.
