² ADJ138 transfers in as a CRJU elective. PED129 transfers in as an ESHE 100 level elective course. Refer to the Transfer Guide above to ensure other substituted courses will transfer.

³ Select from one of the following WCC courses: ART 101, CST 151, HUM 100, HUM 260, MUS 121, PHI 101, PHI 220, REL 200, REL 210, REL 230

⁴ This class will fulfill the Humanistic or Artistic Expression (E) requirement for REAL.

⁵ This class will fulfill the Scientific and Quantitative Reasoning (R) requirement for REAL.

⁶ Students interested in earning a Bachelor of Arts degree will need to take 6-8 credits of foreign language, but won't need to complete an "R" class.

⁷ The Department of Criminal Justice offers minors in Conservation Law Enforcement, Crime Analysis, and Forensic Studies, but students often earn minors from other departments, such as psychology or sociology. ⁸ CRJU100, 320, and 341 are the three required classes for the Forensic Studies minor. The minor requires three Scientific and Quantitative Reasoning (R) classes from a list of selected courses and one of those will count toward the Bachelor of Science requirement.

⁹ The transfer equivalent for ADJ233 should be changed for the 2023/2024 academic term to a CRJU elective, which will allow transfer credit.

Other Notes

In order to receive a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Radford University, students must complete 120 credit hours. Students must complete at least 30 hours at Radford University, including at least half of the hours in the Criminal Justice major. Additional Information is available in the Radford University Undergraduate Catalog. Additional Information about transferring to Radford University is available from the Office of Admissions. For any course to count for transfer, it must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
